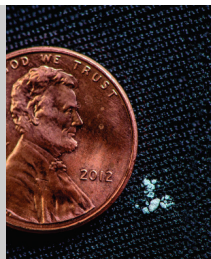
What is Fentanyl?

Fentanyl is a synthetic opioid that is 50 to 100 times stronger than heroin and morphine. It is mixed with other substances like cocaine, heroin, and methamphetamine, and is in counterfeit pills designed to look like legitimate prescription medications. Fentanyl is nearly impossible to detect and can be lethal.

Fentanyl is in New Hampshire in many forms

Without testing, not even experts can tell the difference between a real and fake pill. Don't take a chance; without a prescription, *there is no safe experience*. Medications should only be used as directed by a healthcare professional.

A dose the size of a few grains of salt can be lethal and it is often mixed with other substances. It is now seen in fake pills branded as Oxycodone® and Percocet®, among others.
